

Learner Growth

There was a 50% increase in annual learners, with GPSU bringing in 47 new learners in 2023, expanding into the Northwest and Heartland regions. As the program continues to grow, GPSU expects 80 or more learners in 2024.





There's no such thing as too much experience

Take Elizabeth Sims for example. She has a Bachelor's degree in computer science which she followed up with an MS in Information Technology. And she was an honor student to boot.

Then she enlisted in the Air Force and worked her way up from Security Forces Specialist to Cyber Warfare Operations Officer, where she worked in cloud weapons.

So with a military CV like that, what was the appeal of switching gears and taking the DoD SkillBridge route?

"I ultimately decided that the opportunity to come do SkillBridge on a commercial team was not something I wanted to pass up," she says, "because all of my experience in the field thus far had been in the federal space and the DoD. So I was really looking forward to a chance to come in and train up on what it's like in the commercial space."

She says one of the critical aspects to her GPSU internship was being able to actually interact with and do work for customers. "You can study the theory of something all day long. But I think that getting in there, and actually being able to generate deliverables and have conversations with customers, understand their objectives, understand their businesses and do everything I could to build them useful products, was incredibly important to my learning experience."

In the end, she joined the GPS team where she is a full-time Cloud Security Architect.



Imagine an offer that's good enough to make you forget about retirement

Let's say you have more than a decade of active duty in the military. Retirement is in sight. What would be enticing enough to make you leave your position and embark on a new career path?

Derek Brown found out firsthand. After 14 years of duty in the Navy, even though retirement was within reach, he felt it was time for a change. So he made the jump.

"People looked at me like I had a horn growing out of my head."

But his reasons for doing so were compelling. After all, his kids were growing up—his eldest was entering high school—and constant relocation was an issue. He needed to transition sooner than later. So he made the decision to separate from the military.

After a little online research, Derek discovered that GuidePoint Security is authorized to conduct SkillBridge, Career Skills Program and Hiring Our Heroes internships. Having worked on two different cyber protection teams in the military, Derek brought skills to the

table, such as vulnerability and threat assessment. As his internship, GPSU put him to work within an existing team working on real life customer engagements in projects that developed over several months.

"We jumped in with both feet."

He found that working in real world scenarios on teams with diverse skill sets while solving problems for Fortune 500 companies was key to evolving his knowledge base beyond purely military methods.



"You get that that kind of camaraderie still, going through the program. Even though we've all separated ourselves from the military, we were able to connect and relate to a lot of our experiences that we've had in the past and what we're going through currently."

Minseo Bae knows the difference. He was at Bowdoin College, majoring in Digital and Computational Studies and Sociology, on his way to a career somewhere in IT. Not a bad field. Not a bad educational path. Just one small problem though.

He hated it. Something was missing. He tried software engineering. Hated it. Tried web development. Hated it. Sure, there's a lot of money to be made there, but was it the right way to spend his life?

And then during a gap year, he tried cybersecurity.

"This is cool," he thought. "It doesn't feel like work."

Bae ran with it. It was fun and he loved every single minute of it. And in April of 2023 he completed a four-month remote internship with GuidePoint Security.

He especially enjoyed the first part of the internship where he was allowed to try multiple aspects of cybersecurity before choosing a specialization.

"They let us run around for a little bit...poke at people, knock things around, kind of like a newborn baby getting its footing. That was the biggest highlight, the freedom they gave us at the beginning."

And not only was Bae inspired to give back to his alma mater and create Bowdoin's very first cybersecurity course, but he is also now a full time PAM Engineer for GuidePoint Security.
